WILDLIFE ARC RESCUING OUR WILDLIFE

Wildlife ARC, (Animal Rescue & Care) established in 1987. due to the explosion of development on the Central Coast. The enormous clearing of bush land for housing created an urgent need for a group dedicated to the care and rehabilitation of native animals affected.

Here in the 3 Villages, with the ongoing building work and natural accidents. there is a prolific amount of wildlife including a huge variety of native birds, mice, endangered



frogs, bats, reptiles, including land mullets (giant skinks), echidnas, wallabies etc all needing to be rescued at some time. Tawny Frogmouths are notorious for getting themselves stuck behind brick BBQ's and cheeky possums get into awkward places.

Sugar gliders habitat here but are rarely seen as they are nocturnal and in the treetops. Babies, also called joeys, are injured when they fall from their mothers and need care before releasing them.

Birds are constantly requiring rescue after being entangled in discarded face masks and fishing lines or with fishing hooks embedded in their beaks. One difficult rescue was when a Nankeen Night Heron caught itself on a telephone line from a fishing line around its wing. Luckily, the bird was cut down by a knife on the end of a swimming pool extendable net, caught and released without serious injury!

Remember to cut the loops of masks and dispose of the fishing line appropriately.

Many rescues come from car accidents but surprisingly, the tiny pink joeys from possums and wallabies can be successfully reared from as small as 100 grams so check the pouches of dead marsupials

as joeys can survive up to around 24 hours. Call ARC immediately and leave the joey in its pouch.

ARC is totally volunteer based and receiving over 5000 rescue calls per year, help in all sorts of ways is appreciated. With a small annual fee, all training is totally free of charge. Suzanne Mannion of Yattalunga says "I became a volunteer in 2017. After retiring I wanted to give back to my community and do something worthwhile. Many roles are available, including rescuing, caring, transporting animals from one carer to another or local vet pick-ups. The roster for the rescue answering service can be carried out easily from anywhere." Suzanne goes on to say, "Don't worry, you don't have to be another Steve Irwin!"



Suzanne thanks everyone who voted in the February Greater Bank Community giveaway. ARC received \$2,000 much-needed funds from this. ARC's number is 43250666 seven days pw. Vets do accept injured native wildlife without charging.

RECIPE

Orange Blossom Almond Layer Cake

This month we thought we share a recipe that showcases oranges as a tribute to the orange orchards that use to grow all over the 3 villages.

Ingredients

250g butter, softened

2 ½ cups self raising flour

1 1/3 cups caster sugar

1 cup almond meal

4 eggs

1tbsp orange blossom water

2 tsp grated orange rind

1 cup milk

250g cream cheese

1 tsp vanilla extract

1/3 cup icing sugar mixture

1 cup Greek yogurt

Candied Citrus

Method

Step 1

Preheat oven to 160C/140C. Grease a 7cm-deep, 20cm (base) round cake pan. Line base and side with 2 layers of baking paper.

Step 2

Using an electric mixer, beat butter, flour, caster sugar, almond meal, eggs, orange blossom water, orange rind and milk on low speed for 1 minute or until just combined. Beat on high speed for 4 minutes or until mixture is creamy. Spoon into prepared pan.

Step 3

Bake for 1 hour 30 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the centre of cake comes out clean (cover cake loosely with foil if over-browning). Stand cake in pan for

10 minutes. Turn, top-side up, onto a baking paper-lined wire rack to cool completely.

Step 4

Meanwhile, make Candied Citrus: Place caster sugar and 1 cup of water in a large, heavy-based frying pan over medium heat. Cook, stirring, for 2 to 3 minutes or until sugar has dissolved. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low. Add orange slices. Simmer, turning occasionally, for 8 to 10 minutes or until the pith of the orange is just translucent. Using tongs, transfer to a baking paper-lined tray. Repeat with lemon and grapefruit slices.

Step 5

Using an electric mixer, beat cream cheese and vanilla until smooth. Add icing sugar. Beat until combined. Add yoghurt. Beat on low speed until just combined and mixture thickens slightly.

Step 6

Using a serrated knife, cut cake horizontally into 3 even layers. Place base on a serving plate. Spread with 1/3 of the yoghurt mixture. Top with middle layer of cake and 1/2 the remaining yoghurt mixture. Top with remaining cake layer and yoghurt mixture. Top with citrus slices. Serve immediately.

STEM Sprints in Mathematics at Brisbania Public School

Experts estimate that 60% of young people are studying for jobs that will not exist, or will be

rapidly affected by automation, in the next 10 to 15 years.



It's a reminder of just how important education in science, technology, engineering and maths can be (STEM). Around 75% of all future jobs are expected to call for qualifications or skills in STEM areas, while 90% of jobs will need digital skills in the next 2 to 5 years.

Learning STEM gives students the chance to gain vital life skills including active problem-solving, critical analysis and

clear communication. It also leads to other transferable skills such as creativity, teamwork and independent thinking.

Students at Brisbania Public School participate in STEM sprints once a week, aligned with mathematics. The children are given a problem to solve and then work through the STEM Design Process to define a problem, brainstorm solutions, research and plan, create a product, test and improve the product and then evaluate and share their experience with others.
