"Trees hard as iron, rock as soft as butter"

So an early colonist wrote back to his English family. Robert Henderson knew about this. On the plateau high above Veteran Hall Wharf, named for the land grant he inherited, there is an old ironbark tree that escaped the final axe despite deep cuts because it was "hard as iron". The well named ironbarks are used for slabs in huts, for bridges, piers, wharves, ship building, railways sleepers and in mining for wall supports in mining tunnels.

On the other hand, in September 1869, Henderson easily quarried the "soft as butter" sandstone on Mt Pleasant to erect a wall around his family cemetery in Henderson Rd to protect the dearly departed from the curiosity of the wild

pigs. Just two months later, he was buried there. The ironbark in the photo, along with a yellow bloodwood, cool the White's and Retter's homes in Steyne Road in summer by five degrees or more. An arborist told them it is the biggest spreading

ironwood on the Central Coast, its girth being 5.5 m, height maybe 25 m or more. A photo in the Gosford Library, from the very early 1900s, shows the tree as a young sapling. Rosellas now nest in a hollow in the grand old tree. A nesting hollow that big also tells us the tree is at least 120 years old. Trees need to be 300 years old to have hollows big enough for the big cockatoos, so the cockies we see are probably old – they live as long as we do – and they may not be making babies to replace themselves.

The tree was already more than a sapling when the mayor of Strathfield had his lovely Federation-style home built as a holiday house. The Whites moved into the house in 1983 and,

when they pulled up the linoleum, they found a copy of The Sun dated 8 December, 1919. It cost one penny. So perhaps that indicates the age of their house. It was built a few doors down from a large guesthouse called Earls Court. Holiday makers would come by boat to a wharf and swimming pool below the house at a little beach also known as Earls Court beach. The guesthouse burned down in 1924 but its track down to the water is still mowed by Council.
