

# PROJECT REPORT

### **Police**

We contacted Brisbane water police and asked them to advise us on what numbers to contact and when. Here's the advice they provided.

Triple Zero - 000

While it may be tempting to call triple zero for nonemergency situations, it's important to remember that emergency services are often dealing with lifethreatening situations that require their immediate attention. By calling triple zero for non-emergency situations, we're tying up valuable resources that could be used to save someone's life.

It is important that we keep Triple Zero (000) FOR EMERGANCIES ONLY

Police Link - 131 444

Police Link (131444) operates 24hrs, 7 days a week.

If you are a victim of a crime, other than life threatening or time critical emergency situations, you should contact the Police Link (131 444).

Phoning 131 444 allows you to report crime over the phone. Once your report is completed by a customer service representative, your information is immediately available to your local police.

If the crime you wish to report cannot be taken over the phone, due to its serious nature, the operator will assist by arranging for police to come and see you.

Types of crime you can report to Police Link (131 444) include:

> Break and Enter Fail to Pay for Fuel (Service Stations Only) Motor Vehicle/Vessel Theft Stealing Malicious Damage, including Graffiti Lost Property Taxi Fare Evasion

Police Link (131 444) can also assist you with general police inquiries.

By phoning Police Link, rather than your local police station, you are freeing up Police Officers who could otherwise be on the street actively preventing and investigating crime in your community.

Crime Stoppers – 1800 333 000

For reporting any Criminal Information, you feel Police should know.

Many people may have witnessed criminal or suspicious behaviour but think twice about reporting it to police, because they might know the person and fear possible come backs or retaliation from friends or associates.

Crime Stoppers removes many obstacles by providing an easy, safe and confidential service for people to report crimes or suspicious behaviour. Reports can be made to assist in Missing Person cases or to report criminal offences such as Drugs or Traffic offences.

We hope this information is helpful and of assistance.






