Chart a course for the... 4 Villages - Shipbuilders Heritage Walk Sunday 3 May 2021 shipbuildersheritagewalk.com.au Put it in your Log Book Now

Take a walk along any one of the 3 Villages waterfront reserves right now and you're likely to meet a visitor from Asia or the US State of Alaska. Bar-tailed Godwits can be recognised by their long bills that allow them to probe deeply in the sand and sediment for aquatic worms and molluscs. In their winter range, they flock together where food is plentiful. They frequent tidal

shorelines, breeding in northern climates in the summer there and migrating south for the summer here.

These birds are the world record holders for non-stop flight: recently recorded travelling 11,000 km from Alaska in only 8 days, flying at an average speed of more than 50 km/h. This journey is also a fantastic weight-loss program, as the birds lose almost half of their body weight along the way. Luckily, once they arrive in Australia, our mudflats are waiting, filled with tasty morsels to help them recuperate. Birds breeding in Alaska migrate directly across the Pacific to Australasia, while those from Siberia follow the coast of Asia.

World wide the numbers of these birds is in serious decline, a detailed study showed numbers in New Zealand went from over 100,000 in the late 1980s to 67,500 in 2018. Threats to the birds include hunting in Alaska, however, one of the major problems for the Asian birds has been the shoreline of the Yellow Sea has been transformed dramatically over the last half-century as mudflats have been filled in with solid ground for farmland, ports and related industry. Losing the intertidal flats has proved devastating for the millions of shorebirds that funnel through the Yellow Sea during migration.

Enjoy a great day out on the beautiful Brisbane Water. Get some last minute Xmas shopping done with a fantastic selection of stalls. Kick back to the sounds of local musicians while enjoying some delicious street style food. The Roundabout circus will also be there to entertain the kids.




Following a campaign by both Chinese and international environmentalists in January 2018, the Chinese government announced a sweeping package of reforms aimed at ending much of the land reclamation taking place on the mudflats, hopefully, this will have a positive effect and the numbers of these wonderful visitors will no longer be in decline.
