HERITAGE

Over the past 30 years I have been involved in various projects and campaigns protecting assets which I believed were important to protect for the community. Some of these projects and campaigns were successful, some not so successful. Regardless of the outcome they were all worth the effort, those which were not big winners I don't consider so much a personal loss, but they were a loss to the Community. One campaign I have been involved with recently is the Empire Bay Heritage Boat Shed.

In last months 3 Villages News I brought you the latest information regarding the 100+ year old heritage listed Boat Shed. There had been gathering at the site, which attracted over 200 people including myself, all advocating the preservation of the old facility. The Member for Gosford Liesl Tesch and the newly elected Federal member Gordon Reid were there, Adam Crouch, our State member and Parliamentary Secretary for the Central Coast was unable to attend because of a prior engagement, however, he did indicate there would be a meeting arranged with the newly formed *Empire Bay Heritage Boat Shed Association* and NSW Crown Lands.

This meeting did take place, following which Mr. Crouch announced that because of the heavily polluted nature of the site, requiring full remediation and the dilapidated condition of the facility, the jetties and shed would have to be demolished. However, and this is a BIG 'HOWEVER' the demolition would take place under the supervision of a Heritage expert, all details would be recorded and after the site was remediated the Boat Shed would be rebuilt 'like for like' along with the Jetties. Mr Crouch said on ABC Radio, the new boat shed would not be used as a marina again with both he and the Minister enthusiastic about it becoming a Maritime Museum. If so this would focus on the Brisbane Water District's incredible, national significant ship building history, much of it being within our 3 Villages.

Like many others I've been frustrated that those charged with protecting our history and heritage have not provided a space within the Brisbane Water District that people, including our school children, could come to learn of our area's significant contribution to building our Nation. Now we may well have such a place, a place where every child will come at least once in their school life to learn about their heritage.

While unable to provide marina type maintenance, the aim is to enable Central Coast Ferries to use the facility as a base for their Woy Woy, Saratoga, Davistown, Empire Bay service.

Well done to those people who have driven this campaign, this is a real win for the Community and our heritage.
