#### **HERITAGE**

Jonathan Piper is considered the father of Brisbane Water shipbuilding which saw an estimated 600 ocean going ships built over 125 year period. With wife Ann, he took up residence on a portion of his brother-in-law's property called Brisbania in today's suburb of Yattalunga in 1829.

Piper was born in Sydney on 1 January 1819 and married Ann Bates at Pitt Town on the Hawkesbury River in 1835. A year earlier his sister Sarah married Joseph Spears, the son of a member of the NSW Corps (Rum Corps), and who in 1829, was promised 60 acres of land on Brisbane Water.

This grant was at the head waters of the Cockle (Kincumber) Broadwater, being identified as being 50 chains and 50 links from the mouth of Kincumber Creek (a chain is 20.1168 m and a link is 21 cm). There appears to be strong family ties between the families of Spears and Piper which probably influenced Jonathan and Ann moving to Brisbane Water in 1829.


The Ketch Peacock was the first recorded vessel (1844) built by Jonathan Piper, however, in the 15 years preceding a good number of ships were probably constructed by him without being recorded.

The owners of Peacock were registered as: Jonathan Piper, builder and Joseph Spears,

The ship changed hands three times until being wrecked on 22 January 1876 at the entrance to Camden Haven River, south of Port Macquarie. The second last owner was noted as Edward Foster whose family ran a store at East Gosford in a house formerly owned by Edward Hargraves, the first person to discover gold in Australia. Edward Foster was a mariner, who was a crewman on 'Tim Whiffer' when that vessel capsized in at the Brisbane Water Rip in 1869.

The influence Jonathan, Ann and the Piper family on the region's waters and use of the land cannot be overstated; they were early full time residents not absent landlords as many landowners were. Also significant was the large number of ships built over a 35-year period. During this time Piper taught the shipbuilding trade to many of the area's young men including the four Davis brothers.

Jonathan Piper died on 18 April 1879 age 69; his headstone at St Paul's Church states his birth incorrectly as 1813 but it was really 1810. Ann Piper had 14 children and died in Sydney in 1901 aged 83.
