Behind the Scenes of the 3 Villages Christmas Decorations

Thank you to all our 3 Villages community members who have given us such fantastic feedback on how much they have enjoyed seeing our Tin Soldiers and Candy Canes highlight the beginning of the Christmas Celebrations for the past 2 years.

While we did have an issue with some serious damage to and theft of some of the decorations, we prefer to focus on wonderful 3 Villagers community who support our efforts to add joy and community connection to our area.

We thought you may be interested to know just what is involved in getting the decorations ready and in place for us all to enjoy, so here it is, our step-by-step process that is already in the planning for Christmas 2024.

- 1. At our first committee meeting of the year, we decide on a theme for the cutouts.
- 2. One of our clever committee members designs the template for the year's designs.
- 3. Liaison with Brisbania Public School occurs on the number of cutouts needed by the school and an agreed timeframe for drop off and pick up of the
- 4. The committee sources either donations or purchase of 12 mm marine ply.
- 5. The committee then takes the marine ply and template to Erina Mens Shed who then cut out and seal the cutouts ready for decoration.
- 6. The cutouts are collected from The Mens Shed and dropped at Brisbania School.
- 7. Each class designs, paints and decorates a cutout.

- This year 2 classes even added lights to their candy canes to add to their festive flair.
- 8. We are so grateful to the wonderful staff and children and in particular the School Principal who has supported our efforts for the past two years. Decorating the cutouts is an extra workload for the school and one they have not hesitated to be involved in.
- The completed cutouts are collected from the school and returned to The Mens Shed for the clear lacquer seal.
- 10. The completed cutouts are then placed around our community by our wonderful volunteers and committee members to be enjoyed by all.

MEET THE LOCALS

David and Pam Roberts

I was born in Liverpool where I met my wife Pam and married her 47 years ago. We initially came to Australia by accident, when as a Civil Engineer with British Rail I was offered the opportunity to come to Australia on a secondment as a consultant. At this time our children were 6 and 3 and we were here for 2 years; we fell in love with the place. When we first arrived in Australia we stayed initially in a hotel in Manly and woke up each day to a view of the Pacific Ocean.

I got involved with some interesting projects, such as the Perisher Ski Tube, where we had a role in ensuring the developer met the suitability requirements for operation. In the worst snowfall there for 40 years, our team carried out the pre-commissioning inspections and operational testing.

We returned to the UK after that initial posting, but never stopped thinking about Oz and our friends here. Five years later in 1994, I was offered a job designing the original light rail in Sydney. As a family we jumped at the opportunity to come back and settle permanently. We lived in the Cheltenham – Beecroft area during that time.

Later in my career, I became Director Technical Services at Transport for NSW Projects Division, leading a team of 240 professional engineers, planning and environmental specialists and safety and quality managers. These days across the country, bit by bit 'heritage' seems to be dissapearing, however, locally, for over a decade, a group has been quietly working away to recreate some our lost history. They have been doing this by building scale models like the ships once built in the Brisbane Water District, warships wrecked in the Hawkesbury River and dioramas like that of George Frost's Shipyard on Kincumber Creek. There's fascinating working models, like the steam engines from the Terrigal built vessel General Gordon and a steam driven saw-mill plus artwork has been created to support telling the stories. At its height the local timber industry supported 80 sawmills and provided 4000 jobs. Over the years these works have been exhibited at many community events including, the Putt-Putt Regatta, 4 Villages-Shipbuilders Heritage Walk, Davistown Hall Centenary Event and the Gosford Regional Show. Selected works have also been taken to schools for Rotary supported history lessons.

By 2019 and seriously running out of space to both work on the projects and safely store them and/or also display some of them, a meeting took place and the Central Coast Community Model Makers Mens Shed (CCCMMMS) was formed. The primary aim remains providing support for mens health, however, secondary aims are to provide a place where school groups can learn of local history and encourage tourist visits to help cover expenses.

Various sites for a 'CCCMMS Shed' were trialed and failed before Gosford Showground was considered, two sites were identified but were rejected following detailed assessment Cont. P6

by the management. A year passed before a third site was proposed and this time it was approved, however, another delay was experienced gaining State Government approval.

Earlier in December 2021, a very positive (zoom) meeting was held with David Harris, Member for Wyong. Following the 2023 NSW elections, a follow-up meeting took place with him, now as Minister for the Central Coast and this resulted in him contacting the Minister responsible for Crown Lands. Things then moved quickly and in January this year, almost five years since forming the CCCMMMS, a lease was signed for the site of a 'Shed', which is going to be a bit different from the norm, offering some additional community, educational and economic benefits.


