Finding bushwalks a little further afield is easy by looking at websites such as wildwalks.com where length and difficulty are noted.

It's important to plan ahead, and safety tips to bear in mind include telling someone where you're going and what time you expect to be back; maybe let your friend know you're home again. Keep to the track/path and stay away from the edges of cliffs or other drops. Avoid treading on plants and please don't pick anything. Even though the weather is cooler, be sun safe—take water with you and some food, even if it's only a snack and you don't eat it, and pack some warm clothes in case the weather changes drastically. Pop in some insect repellent, and you might find that an offline map app can also be useful.

With an estimated 30,000 children living in poverty, there is a great need for us, as a community, to rally together to support the work of this organization. "We Care Connect" provides essential items to these vulnerable children and their families to try to ease some of the difficulties they face in life. "We Care Connect" does not receive any government funding

"We Care Connect" does not receive any government funding and relies totally on community donations of quality children's clothing (0 to 18 years) and equipment such as cots, car seats, linen, toys, blankets and toiletries. These goods are then sorted, cleaned, repaired and packed into handmade cloth bags which are sewn by many volunteer community hands. This volunteer-based charity organization has over 90 volunteers who pack the bags and prepare any equipment ready for collection by case workers from over 400 services who are supporting these identified families in need.

You may ask, how can a bowling club like Davo help? They hold a charity day, a business sponsors event, a Christmas toy collection campaign, and every wrong bias bowled on the green gives an extra dollar to this charity. Davistown RSL Bowling Club is proud of their association with "We Care Connect." HECTOR (HEC) PETRONII



I was born in Suez, Egypt, to Maltese parents in 1926. I am one of eight children six boys and two girls. One sister turned 101 last week. Even though I was born in Egypt, I am not an Egyptian citizen, as you must be at least third generation Egyptian-born to be classified as an Egyptian citizen.

I was educated in English schools and can speak five languages: Italian, French, Arabic, Maltese, and English. I have six grandchildren and five great-grandchildren. I began working in a shipping firm as a shipping clerk; however, around 1946, Europeans were being moved out of Egypt due to world conflict. My uncle was living in Australia, so I asked him if he would support me to immigrate. I asked my boss if I could go on one of our wheat cargo ships, the King Alfred, and he agreed. I arrived in Port Adelaide, went to Melbourne, and then arrived in Matraville. I began work at General Motors Holden. I stayed two years and then began work with ICI Chemical Factory as a tradesman assistant and then moved on to a production clerk. My manager was happy with my work and suggested I study accountancy. By this time, I was married with three children and one on the way. I worked all day and studied at night for my English Equivalent School Certificate as I had no paperwork from my schooling. I eventually became a CPA and stayed with ICI for ten years. I then moved to Boral Refinery with the blessing of my old manager and stayed there for ten years.

I branched out again and started my own accounting practice, but this was a battle, so I joined with a partner to start Kelly Staines and Petroni Accounting. This did

not end well, so I was working on my own again, but by then, I had met my second wife. We had many happy years together, including moving to Davistown in 1998, where we built our own home on Illoura Reserve. I was auditing accounts for the Solicitors Trust Fund, the Real Estate Agents Trust, and the Travel Agents Trust Account. My interests have included:

- Being a member of St Vincent de Paul
- Being a Rotarian until I moved to the Central Coast, including holding the position of Treasurer and also Auditor for the Rotary Club of Maroubra Randwick Market Account. I received a Paul Harris Award during my time in Rotary.

HISTORY

THOMAS DAVIS AND THE GENERAL - Part 1

In 1829, Joseph Spears received a 60-acre land grant at the northern head of the 'Kincumba' Broadwater, which he named *Brisbania*. Not long after, Jonathan Piper, a shipwright, established residence on the southwestern portion of this land, adjacent to the modern suburb of Yattalunga.

It is likely Piper soon commenced shipbuilding; however, ship registrations had not yet commenced, so his first documented ship was the *Peacock* in 1844. Over the next 125 years, around 600 named ships were constructed in the Brisbane Water District, with Jonathan Piper considered the father of the industry. In 1833, teacher William Davis, his wife Sarah, and their eight children

arrived in Port Jackson aboard the ship *Mary Catherine*. Following the birth of another son, the family took up residence in the Brisbane Water District where William worked as a "parochial teacher" at a school near the old St Paul's Church. Tragically, Sarah passed away in 1845 at the age of 47 with William dying the following year. Jonathan Piper then took four of the orphaned Davis brothers, Benjamin, Rock, Edward and Thomas under his wing, teaching them the shipbuilding trade. The brothers later established their own shipyards about 2 km south of Piper's yard along the Cockle Creek Channel, an area that, due to the many Davis families living there, became known as 'Davistown'.

Thomas Davis went on to build 23 ships at Davistown, but as local timber resources became depleted, he moved his enterprise to Terrigal Haven where he constructed another 21 ships. He constructed a stone slipway and established a sawmill. An open creek once discharged into the Haven which was dammed, creating a lagoon where the sports oval is today. Davis eventually gained ownership of most of Terrigal and North Avoca which he logged extensively. A tramway was built to transport timber up the steep North Avoca hill; today, Tramway Rd. follows much of the original route.
