OUR WILDLIFE

For those who do the Kincumber to Davistown–Broadwater walk, I'd like to point out something a lot of you may be missing – a real David Attenborough event.

Look to the water and you will see 100+ birds hunting as a pack. Why? This time of year, the fish have spawned, and the bay is full of newly-spawned fry. This triggers a feeding frenzy for everyone where birds and fish hunt together.

What is amazing is how they all work together – friend and foe – cormorants, darters, grebes, terns, seagulls, pelicans, herons and more.

Fish (often taylor) that are the prey to most of the birds are accepted. Birds that would normally not tolerate another water bird are accepted. Each have a role to play and they are very much like an army.

Here's how I see it working;

The taylors roughly round-up the fry. In go the Australasian grebe's that have migrated here for the event. These guys look like the cormorants but a third of the size, and faster.

Next are the cormorants and darter closely behind. Just like the infantry.

Don't forget you still have the taylor working below. Some fry jump only to be caught by the hovering terns. Sitting on the surface are seagulls snapping at any injured and dead fish. They are the airforce.

Behind the lot, are the pelicans. These guys are the tanks. They get anything trying to slip past.

The water waders seem to know when the events will head to shore. They get in there and wait. All three egrets we get in this area (great, intermediate and little egrets) will be on the shoreline along with nankeen night herons and white-faced herons.

So, next time you're on your morning walk, look to the water, there's always something interesting going on.

Give me a wave as you walk past and you'll always get a g'day back from me.

HERITAGE

In last month's 3 Villages News, I told of a recent trip to Newcastle Harbour with two mates to see a replica of a very historic ship, the William IV which was the first ocean going steam ship built in Australia. The replica we went on board was built for the Bicentenary in 1987. The original William IV was built in 1829 and purchased by the Brisbane Water Steam Packet Co. in 1840. For many years, twice a week, the ship passed by Saratoga en-route to its usual mooring at East Gosford wharf. If the ship was carrying horses it would probably off-load this cargo at Saratoga's Veteran Hall Wharf. One of the gentlemen who accompanied me to Newcastle was Bill Bollard, a retired Naval Architect, who was responsible for re-designing the ship's below deck spaces to accommodate a new engine and carrying out the necessary stability test after the engine was fitted.

We were all inspired by the visit to see William IV, but none more so than Bill, who had done all the drawings of the vessel, and the very next day started building a model of the ship. The other member of our party was Bob Hornby, a retired engineer whom I contacted after viewing Bill's work-in-

progress to ask if he would construct working paddles for the project. I will probably be employed to rig the ship and then it will go on permanent public exhibition.

We expect to have the model much more advanced and with the paddles fitted by the time of the Putt-Putt Regatta & Wooden Boat Festival where it will it be previewed. Come along to the Rotary / 4HResearch / Model Makers Mens Shed stand
