I would like to introduce you to **Joy Collier**. I first met this beautiful lady at one of her regular visits to "Days for Girls", Avoca Beach.

Joy, an ex-Textiles, Design, and Food Tech teacher, volunteers each Thursday alongside 40 other ladies and sews reusable sanitary kits for girls and women, and also volunteers with "Global Kids Clothing", making new clothes for children in Australia and third-world countries.

Born in Bega, Joy met her future husband, Bill, on their first day of teaching at Bega High School and married in 1969. After saving for a few years, the young couple purchased a block of land in Saratoga and then moved to the UK for three years teaching and travelling throughout Europe and Africa in the back of an old Bedford truck. They also journeyed to Kabul after refitting a ten-year-old ambulance in the UK.

Once back in Australia in 1974, Joy taught in Albury before starting a family, moved to Deniliquin, and had their second son there.

The Central Coast called, and they built their family home. The boys attended Brisbania Public School and then Central Coast Grammar. Joy taught at St. Joseph's, East Gosford and Bill at Henry Kendall High School.

IN THE GARDEN

Bug attack? Attack back!

I've been battling with some bugs over the last few weeks and perhaps you might be too.

These particular bugs are on my navel orange tree, but they'll inhabit any citrus tree, and are called bronze orange bugs (Musgravia sulciventris). They're also known as 'stink bugs' for the nasty smelling and caustic defence mechanism that they can emit when disturbed. They are sap-suckers and will weaken your tree to the point of stopping

They are sap-suckers and will weaken your tree to the point of stopping fruit production if left unchecked.

If you noticed these shield-like bugs on your fruit trees, you might think you have a few different bugs to deal with. The ones you'll probably see at first will vary from light green, to orange then to brown as adults. They're all the same bug.

Look at the underside of the leaves. You might spot the eggs: a little cluster of lime green dots in a honeycomb type pattern. **Cont. P4**

From P3. Put on some gloves and squish 'em. If you find a cluster but they're white, you're too late, they've already hatched. The next stage is the nymph, which I've never seen but are little lime green critters.

I don't like to use sprays, so I go for eye protection and gloves (against their nasty squirts). Pick the bugs off and drop them into a bucket of water that has some liquid soap mixed in and they'll quickly drown. I've heard an old vacuum cleaner with a disposable bag can be used too. Just vacuum them then throw out the sealed bag. The smell is too bad to use your normal vacuum cleaner. A daily patrol, if you're able, will soon reduce their numbers. We found around 100 the first day and now, after a week, we're almost down to single figures. Good luck!
